Summer 1: The Ancient Kingdom of Benin







Children will learn about what life was like in the Ancient Kingdom of Benin and the significant achievements and individuals. They will make associations between their knowledge of empire and the connections between the Kingdom of Benin and Britain at that time. Children will discuss and debate key issues such as whether the Benin bronzes should be

ART: PAINTING & MIXED MEDIA

Children explore how artists work collaboratively to produce works on larger scale and represent historical cultures from a contemporary perspective.







Children will build on their understanding of empire through their learning of the make-up of the Commonwealth. They will learn about physical geography and the natural resources of different Commonwealth countries. As part of this, they will learn about the positive and negative impact of humans on the environment. They will learn how views of the Commonwealth have changed over time and why this might be.

D&T: TEXTILES

Children design and make a textile produce inspired by the diversity of Modern-day Britain.
